HERE IS AN EXAMPLE OF HOW YOUR GIFT IS CHANGING THE STORY EACH DAY:

6:30 a.m.

A chronically homeless individual staying at the **Bartlett House** begins their day with case management assistance, peer counseling, and job hunting.

Several United Way funded partners are working to help provide a fighting chance to homeless individuals in our community.

10:30 a.m.

A mother of four visits **Scott's Run Settlement House** for assistance providing food for her family. The pantry provides her with food assistance and tips for making the most of her cooking habits.

Last year, over 50,500 people visited food pantries in Monongalia and Preston counties. United Way is proud to support food programs through funding, food drives, and coordinated support.

3:45 p.m.

A father who recently lost his job stops at **Christian Help**, where he receives food, clothing for job interviews, and support to help him make the most of his limited budget.

Last year, 13,538 people in our community received help from United Way-funded programs in income.

6:15 p.m.

An adult "student" meets with a **Literacy Volunteers** tutor to improve their overall reading, writing, and literacy skills.

Each year, United Way supports programs that help individuals become self-sufficient with the assistance of mentors, classes, referrals, and more.

10:00 p.m.

After suffering domestic abuse, a young mother calls **RDVIC** for shelter where she and her children can receive support.

RDVIC provides resources, support, and a safe place for them.

8:00 a.m.

Patients begin filing into **Milan Puskar Health Right**. By the end of the day, over 50 individuals with limited or no medical insurance will receive medical treatment.

Over 32,000 prescriptions were filled last year for those in need.

1:15 p.m.

Amy, a home health aide through **Visiting Homemakers** arrives at the home of a client to help with cleaning and preparing meals.

Over 22,600 hours of home health assistance were provided last year.

5:00 p.m.

Sarah, a 4th grader, works on her homework at **The Shack Neighborhood House**. She asks for help from junior volunteer mentors who work daily to prepare young people for success.

Last year, 3,750 children received help from United Way-funded programs in education.

7:45 p.m.

Kevin, a high school freshman, packs up after an evening work session preparing for the LEGO robotics competition through **Mountaineer Area Robotics (MARS)**.

Hundreds of youth are exploring STEM education and careers through programs like MARS.

Midnight

A family who lost their home to a fire receives emergency housing, food, and clothing from the **American Red Cross**.

Last year, 10 families were assisted during their time of need.
